A CHILD OF GOD.

In the reading from Acts 3:12-19, we may ask ourselves, Who is Peter to have such boldness to stand before the authority to testify about who Jesus is? - the one Jesus called to walk on the sea, doubted and sunk (Matthew 14:22-33). In fact, in the synoptic gospels, Christ prophesies that Peter will deny him three times (Luke 22:55-62; Matthew 26:69-75 and Mark 14:66-72), and he does so, coming to feel guilt for his human weakness. But something remarkable happens. Peter encounters the truth and is empowered by the Spirit of God, which changes the narrative of his past. He recognizes his new identity in Christ. When we come to Jesus, he offers us a gift of salvation, enabling us to live as God's transformational representatives in creation. On the other hand, as children of God, we should also expect that many people today will have trouble understanding our values and sense of identity.

In a culture of individualism, we find our place in a community, the body of Christ. In an age that seeks security through violence, we stand for solidarity, forgiveness, and peace. In a society that finds personal identity through social networking, we discover our true name in baptism and following Christ. Our birth certificate states our natural identity, and our baptism certificate declares our true identity. We are loved, claimed, and redefined as nothing less than God's children. Yet, we often live with double identities, old and new. The old identity, too plain to ignore and too powerful to escape, pulls us down in despair. Encased in our past, we struggle to believe in the new identity, thinking it's too good to be true. We look into our hearts honestly and with fearless self-searching, and we have to say, "A child of God? Not me!" John understands that this new identity is difficult for some to accept, so he urges: "my brothers and sisters, let no one deceive you." (1 Jn. 3:7a). Be confident in Jesus that you have been accepted. The living God, who was and is in Christ, lovingly overcomes ignorance and death so that the world may experience the life that proceeds from the knowledge and experience of God.

It is through Jesus that we are claimed and accepted as God's children, a truth that should guide our every thought and action.
