My Reflection on Sunday's Preaching (2 Timothy 1:6-14)

Paul was in prison when he wrote to Timothy, a young man in his 30s. Paul knew his end was imminent at the time and wrote this to his fellow beloved in the Lord Timothy in verse 14 (14 Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us). It was a time in the history of the church when people were offended when they heard Jesus was the Messiah; they thought it was a shame for the Saviour to be crucified on the cross.

But wrote this to Timothy amid these opposition to "guard the gospel you were given." this Gospel is about the birth, the life, the death, and the resurrection of Jesus. It is cross-shaped, vertical and horizontal—our relationship with God and one another. We deny the truth or shrink the Gospel when we fail to tell people about this truth and lead them to Jesus. We shrink the Gospel when we tell people that Jesus was a philosopher, a lovely young man, just like one of the prophets, not God. A call to be a disciple of Jesus is to follow Jesus' radical way, challenge the culture, care for the poor, fight against the injustices in our community, and love the unloved.

So, Paul told Timothy to guard this Gospel; this truth, we too are encouraged by Paul that we must defend this Gospel we must never compromise this truth. It should be part of our everyday conversations, proclaiming this wherever we find ourselves. We are not to expect that in sharing this too, we would not face opposition; we will face resistance, but that should not prevent us from preaching the truth about the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is an urgent call to share with others this truth. Christ-centred Gospel confronts, transforms, and challenges us. Therefore, we must be ready; sometimes, we may be that difficult person because we are being challenged or challenging others, whichever this may be; in Paul's words, "be prepared to suffer for the Gospel." Ministry or a call to discipleship is a call to deny oneself. To take up one's cross and follow the radical Jesus. He calls us to a path that will be hard, a self-denying journey. The church is a community of saints and sinners; we must defend this truth in love. When we compromise the Gospel, we can sense the total absence of God's presence in our midst. Be ready to guard the truth, be challenged, and be confronted. Don't let this lead you to deny the truth- Jesus is the only way to salvation.
