The Resurrection of Jesus

In John's Gospel (John 20:1-18), Jesus cares a lot about seeing and believing. Throughout the account, people are told to look around them and to pay attention to what they see so that they may believe in Jesus. At the beginning of the Gospel, as Jesus calls the first disciples, they are invited to "come and see" (1:39) as they join him on the journey they believed. Once people see things in John's Gospel, they believe. But when we get to the horrible visions of the Holy Week. Betrayal, arrest, unjust condemnation, death on a cross and burial in a borrowed tomb. Who wants to see that? What are we supposed to see in those events? How are we supposed to believe in LIFE when we see only death? So, we get it when Mary shows up that morning to weep at the tomb. Mary can't let go of Jesus. She isn't ready to relinquish what she thinks she knows about life and death. The world she lived in last week had problems; for sure, they have taken away Jesus, someone who accepted her and included her as his friend.

And then she sees Jesus standing there and hears him ask, "Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you looking for? And even as she supposes him to be the gardener, you wonder if she begins to see and believe as she hears his voice. Mary wondered, but when Jesus calls her by name, "Mary," that's what it takes for Mary to turn around, away from an empty tomb, and away from seeing and believing in death to seeing and believing in LIFE. When Jesus called "Mary," she sees him and finally believes. How glorious that moment must have been for Mary in the garden. How powerful that word of resurrection was for her grieved spirit. The sound of her name on Jesus' lips changed everything. The hope for resurrection for all people is that the living God calls all from darkness into light by name.

Moreover, John's Gospel begins with "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God" (John 1:1), opening in the darkness of the first creation as in Genesis 1:1 with Jesus, the Word. In the end of the Gospel, Jesus is again in the garden at the first light. Bringing forth forgiveness and new life so that his disciples can begin their calling anew. Unlike the first creation, the Garden of Eden, where Adam hid from God when God called him, Eve (the Woman) was generally the one Adam blamed. Instead, in this garden in John, the Woman responded, and Jesus sent her out to be the first evangelist to announce the new creation. She responded in faith. The resurrection story needs to be shared, and we are those entrusted with this message of hope. The sadness of Good Friday is over, and the new day of hope is today, and we have been chosen to be the evangelists of the resurrection.

Now is our turn. Jesus is saying to future generations of Mary Magdalens, "I need you to be signs of that new life right here and now." Like Mary, we long to be known by God. As Jesus did for Mary, Jesus comes to us not as a general idea or an imagined ghostly figure but as a presence that reaches beyond our minds' powers of knowing and touches our lives in ways we cannot see. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is God's promise that all creation will be raised to life with God. God will make all things new, giving us hope and assurance that our lives will not end just on this earth. The resurrection is the foundation of our eschatological hope.
